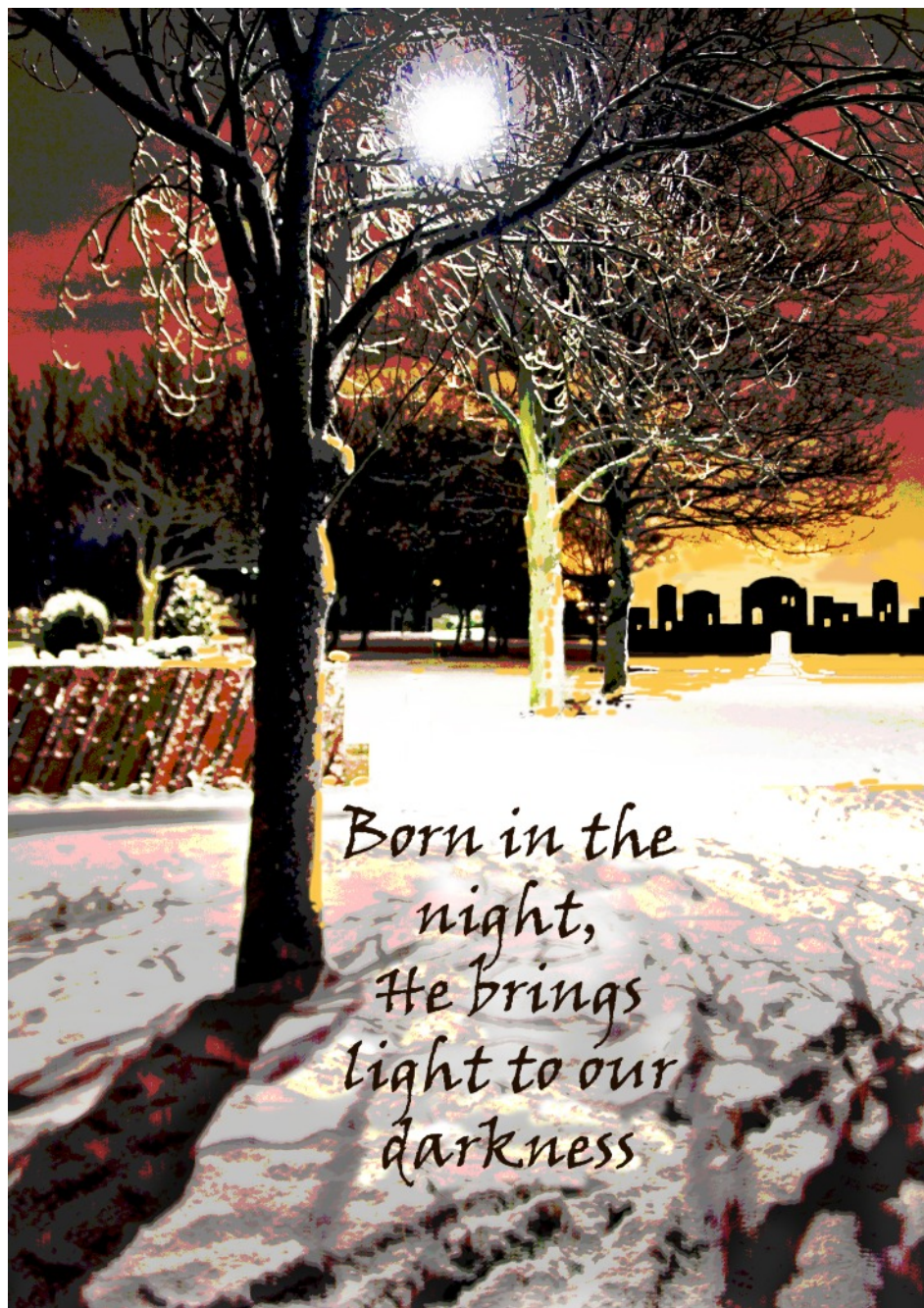

I've been privileged to lead this little band of local singers for over a year now. We are delighted to have provided support for our local churches on feast days and at United Benefice services, singing anthems suitable for the occasions, and of course carols at Christmas time.

Specially-trained volunteers spend around two hours a week doing simple, everyday things which can make a huge difference to people's quality of life - things like lending a listening ear, sharing a cup of tea and a chat, going for a walk or out to the cinema. Having a volunteer visitor also makes a difference to carers and family by offering some much-needed 'me' time. These everyday heroes don't need superpowers or special skills – just a genuine commitment to caring for and about someone. The charity matches volunteers and patients carefully, so you may even be able to share your hobby or interests with each other. All volunteers receive full training before they start and have plenty of expert support from the team at Saint Michael's, to ensure the experience is beneficial to everyone.



"I feel very privileged to be a volunteer visitor," said Sandra Monkman Charlton, who started volunteering with the service earlier this year. "I get so much out of it but I definitely feel I'm doing a worthwhile job".

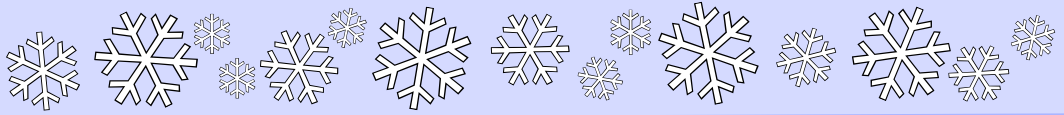

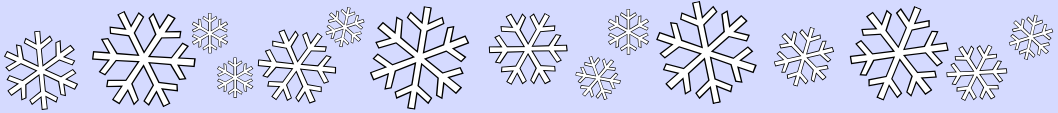

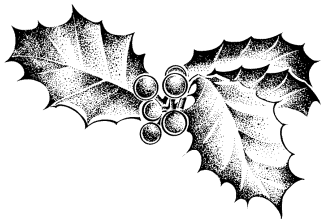


HOLLY

We sing about the Holly and the Ivy and prickly green leaves and red berries are everywhere in Christmas decorations.

In Scandinavian countries the holly is even known as the Christ-thorn and it seems that the name of the holly actually came from the word holy .

The holly reminds us of the death of Jesus the sharp prickles on the leaves are like the crown on thorns that Jesus was forced to wear on the cross. The red berries remind us of the drops of blood that came where the thorns hurt his head.



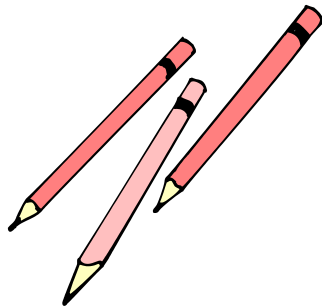
Holly is an evergreen, which means that it does not lose its leaves in the autumn, but keeps them all year round. And because its leaves are always green it is a symbol of eternal life.

SHARP PRESENTS

A quick way to make little presents for all your class and friends.

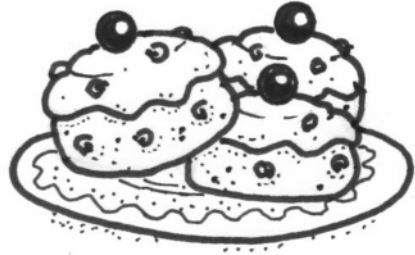
