All in the month of June

75 years ago: on 25th June 1942 that The Daily Telegraph newspaper published the first account of the mass murder of Polish Jews. It reported that Germany had murdered 700,000 already, and that a further 1000 a day were being killed in gas chambers at Auschwitz. It was reported to be 'the greatest massacre in history' yet the story was largely ignored; it only made page 5 of the newspaper, and the other newspapers did not even run it.

70 years ago: on 5th June 1947 that the Marshall Plan was proposed. US Secretary of State George C Marshall proposed a self-help programme for Europe that would enable countries to rebuild democratic societies and resist communism after WWII.

60 years ago: on 27th June 1957 that Britain's Medical Research Council reported that there was a cause-andeffect relationship between smoking and lung cancer. As a result, the Minister of Health said he had a duty to warn the public of the risks smokers faced.

50 years ago: on 1st June 1967 the album Sgt. Pepper's Lonely Hearts Club Band was released by the Beatles.

Also 50 years ago: on 5th to 10th June 1967 that the Six-Day War began. Israel launched pre-emptive air strikes against Egypt and then pushed into Jordan and Syria. Israel captured the Gaza Strip and Sinai Peninsula from Egypt, the West Bank from Jordan, and the Golan Heights from Syria.

Also 50 years ago: on 17th June 1967 that China successfully tested its first

hydrogen bomb, becoming the fourth country to develop a thermonuclear weapon.

30 years ago: on 11th June 1987 that Margaret Thatcher became the only British Prime Minister of the 20th century to win three consecutive terms in office.

25 years ago: on 1st June and 16th June respectively, that Russia became a member of the International Monetary Fund and the World Bank.

Also 25 years ago: on 22nd June 1992 that Andrew Morton's controversial book 'Diana – Her True Story' was published. It claimed she was deeply depressed and unstable, and had made several suicide attempts.

20 years ago: on 3rd June 1997 that Lionel Jospin became Prime Minister of France.

Also 20 years ago: on 12th June 1997 that Shakespeare's Globe Theatre opened in London. It is a reconstruction of the original theatre of 1599, located about 230 metres from the original site. (Editor: are there any English Lit. students in your church who would like to write about their visit to the Globe?)

15 years ago: on 3rd & 4th June 2002 that Queen Elizabeth II celebrated her Golden Jubilee.

Also 15 years ago: on 21st June 2002 that the World Health Organisation declared Europe polio-free.

10 years ago: on 29th June 2007 that Apple released the first iPhone.





St RICHARD of CHICESTER

St Richard of Chichester, who lived from 1197 to 1253, is patron saint of the English county of Sussex.

In 1244 Richard was elected Bishop of Chichester but King Henry III wanted someone else as bishop and he ordered that no one should feed or house Richard. So Richard lived with a friend who was a parish priest and visited his entire diocese on foot for two years until the king relented.

Richard is widely remembered today for the prayer he is supposed to have said as he was dying. The prayer was adapted for the song 'Day by Day' in the musical Godspell and it is in this form that most people know it today:

> Day by day, Dear Lord, of thee three things I pray: To see thee more clearly, Love thee more dearly, Follow thee more nearly, Day by Day.

Askwith With Weston WI Report

Charlotte Leeming, long-time presenter of BBC Look North, came along and gave us a wonderful talk about her career in broadcasting with lots of funny stories along the way. Most notably covering the tragic death of Jo Cox, the labour MP for Batley and Spen, and the recent child abuse trials in Yorkshire, which were extremely harrowing. But she had lots of funny anecdotes too and of course she's interviewed many famous people, perhaps most notably for her, Gary Barlow when he came to Leeds to promote the 'Calendar Girls' musical. Apparently he was a dream to interview !

Charlotte loves the WI and all it stands for and was thrilled to come along and talk to us. She's utterly charming and down to earth and questions continued virtually until the end of the meeting. We all left with smiles on our faces.

Our visit to Harewood House in April was very enjoyable. We had a guided tour of the Victoria exhibition, which is based on the ITV series 'Victoria', some of which was filmed at the house, and, apart from displaying costumes from the series, the curators of the exhibition have delved into the Harewood archives and found many artefacts relating to the house and family in Victorian times. The exhibition runs throughout the summer and it's well worth a visit. We've got other trips arranged during the next few months, also we'll be serving tea and cakes at Askwith, Weston and Denton Open Gardens in June. Plus there's our usual volunteering in the WI Pavilion at the Great Yorkshire Show in July, and our Craft Club, Walking Group, and monthly Lunch Club.


