Dear Friends,

It is with very mixed feelings that I write my last letter for this magazine.

It is my final letter because, under the Methodist Stationing system, Methodist Ministers move every five years. There is an option to ask to extend an appointment beyond the five years; but after much careful prayer and thought, and conversation with trusted Christian sisters and brothers I discerned that God' will was for me to move. I will move in early August to the Lancashire mill town of Oswaldtwistle and will serve as Minister to Methodist Churches in Oswaldtwistle, Accrington and Haslingden. I will leave it to others to decide which is the "right" side of the Pennines!

One of the joys of ministry in the Washburn Valley has been the excellent ecumenical relationships, particularly between Methodists and Anglicans. I have particularly valued the support and colleagueship of Rev Graham Shield and his wife Julie and will have particularly fond memories of shared Covenant services. I wish Graham well during his time off and invite you to join with me in continuing to pray for him and Julie.

I came to you in September 2012 as a Probationer, as a wet behind the years Minister with lots of enthusiasm and ideas but little experience. You have all been incredibly patient as I made my early mistakes and graciously forgiving too. A Steward at one of my churches commented that I leave a very different Minister from the one who arrived and that is due in no small part to the care, love and guidance I have received from members of Timble and Norwood Methodist Churches and also from other Christian brothers and sisters in the valley.

My last service in the valley will be the Timble Chapel Anniversary Service on Sunday 16th July at 2:30pm. I hope that you will all be able to come and join me and my wife Sue for our last service together in the valley.

I hope that I have served you well as the Methodist Minister in the valley and pray that you will continue to grow in grace and in the love of God and of his Son, Jesus Christ our Lord.

Can I ask for your prayers for our last few weeks together and for myself and Susan as we prepare to move to Oswaldtwistle?

St. IGNATIUS of LOYOLA: 31st July

The youngest of 13 children, Ignatius Loyola was born in Spain. When a young soldier he was badly wounded by a cannon ball that shattered his leg. As he recovered he asked for a best selling book of the day, a romance, to read to take his mind off the pain but ended up reading about Jesus and the lives of the saints. His life changed as he resolved to continue being a soldier, but now as a soldier for Christ.

In 1534, at the age of 43, he and 6 others offered themselves to the service of the Catholic Church. They became the Society of Jesus and Ignatius was elected to serve as their first general. When other Jesuits were sent on various missions by the pope, Ignatius stayed in Rome founding homes for orphans and colleges all, in the words of the Jesuit motto, 'ad

majorem Dei gloriam' - for the greater glory of God

Askwith With Weston WI Report

Our June meeting was delayed for a week as the village hall was an election polling station on our usual meeting night. However it was worth the wait because this month we welcomed Jo Banks from Harrogate Garden and Flower School. Jo's love of gardening persuaded her to switch careers from nursing to gardening and she qualified at RHS Harlow Carr. After time away she eventually returned to Harrogate and set up her own garden and flower school where she specialises in using local grown, seasonal, and scented flowers in all her classes and workshops, and in her flower styling business.

She arrived with two buckets of flowers freshly cut from her garden, mostly sown and raised by Jo, and told us that she's a member of the British flower growing network, Flowers from the Farm, who's profile is growing as many people are thinking again about where the flowers they buy come from and how many air or road miles are involved in getting them into this country. She believes that with the popularity of the slow food movement our attention is now turning to slow flowers too, locally grown, sustainable, and often wonderfully scented with a good vase life.

As she talked she proceeded to put together a hand-tied arrangement containing peonies, alchemilla, anemones, scabious, achillea, astrantias, and salvias. She showed us how to arrange the flowers at different heights and how the colour of one flower accented another. Before long she'd produced the most stunning arrangement which we all applauded and she generously gave it to us as a raffle prize. It was a wonderful demonstration for a Summer's night and we had lots of questions for her afterwards.

Towards the end of June we're providing the tea and cakes on Saturday 24th at Weston, Askwith, and Denton Open Gardens weekend, and then in early July almost thirty of us are off to Wentworth Woodhouse in South Yorkshire, which has been much in the news recently, and our trip's eagerly anticipated. We're even allowing husbands along too!

Also in July a number of us are volunteering in the WI Pavilion at the Great Yorkshire Show providing food and refreshments for hundreds of hungry visitors. WI members from all across the North Yorkshire West area volunteer for this event so it's also a chance to catch up with old friends.

On the 3rd of August, between 2 and 4pm in the Village Hall, we're having 'Tea With The Girls' when we'll be serving tea and home-made cakes and raising funds for Bloodwise (formerly Leukaemia and Lymphoma Research), and we're absolutely delighted to announce that a number of the 'Calendar Girls' will be joining us. The event's open to everyone whether you're a WI member or not.

Otherwise we've got our monthly walking and craft groups, and lunch club. We're a very friendly WI and welcome potential members and visitors from around the area to our meetings on the 2nd Thursday of the month, 7.30pm, at Askwith Village Hall. 
Washburn Parish Council
