ecember is the time we speak of Peace and Hope, Goodwill to all.

God came among us as a vulnerable child, with his parents having to rely on the generosity of others to provide a safe haven for his birth. The familiar nativity scene on our Christmas cards seems cosy and idyllic, far from the reality of anxiety and distress they must have felt before they found shelter. Jesus started his life with no home and then had to flee from persecution and live as a refugee before he was able to settle. So many today experience the same.

So where was the Hope in all of this? The Angel Gabriel came to Zechariah, Mary and the Shepherds to proclaim Christs coming for all of humanity. He came to usher in a new way of living according to God's will. A radical way of loving all of humanity and not just the few, a way of reconciliation and not retaliation, a way of respect and inclusion and not judgement and exclusion. God identified himself with the poor, the refugee, the lost and the helpless. Jesus was declared as God with Us and through his death and resurrection he lives within each of us. We too can then identify with the least, the lost and the lonely. The Hope for the world is that each of us who proclaims Jesus as Lord and Saviour can achieve great things and bring healing to the world through our witness and actions. Let us dare to believe that we can change the world through the power and strength of God as we work together. The season of Hope is for all time.

The pattern of services in the following months will, to some extent, be determined by the Church's calendar (e.g. the Sundays of Lent, Easter etc). In creating the pattern we have built on the following principles:

- I. Each parish (n.b. not church) will have not less than two services each month.
- 2. At least one of the above will be a Communion Service.
- 3. At Leathley and Weston where there is currently the use of the Book of Common Prayer (BCP) for Holy Communion this will continue. (Note on the **first** Sunday each month at Weston and **third** Sunday at Leathley. This provides for two opportunities within the Benefice for those who prefer BCP.)
- 4. Morning Services will include the usual mix of Morning Prayer, Family Service and other special events (including Baptisms as required).
- 5. From time to time, other forms of worship may take place at different times/days in addition to, or in place of Sunday worship.
- 6. United Benefice Services will normally continue to be held in those months which have a fifth Sunday. We shall also look for other opportunities for additional joint services.

The ministry team is committed to discover how your needs may be met by our present and future patterns of worship.








What about the first Christmas?

How did the early Christians celebrate Christmas? The simple answer is: they didn't!

Christmas was first celebrated as late as 336, during the reign of Emperor Constantine. The first Christians didn't celebrate Jesus' birth or any other birthdays, regarding them as pagan customs to be avoided. However, the resurrection was central to their faith and they celebrated this event every Sunday.

By the 4th century however, many Christian groups observed Christ's birthday, although on different days. So, in 345, Pope Julius I officially fixed the date of Christmas as 25th December. Why was this date chosen?

Early Christian tradition said that the Jesus' birth was announced to Mary on 25th March (the Annunciation), nine months before 25th December. As time went on, the Annunciation became more associated with Mary than Jesus' birth. It was also believed to be the day on which Jesus died (14th Nisan in the Jewish calendar).

In the setting of Passover, as Jews from all over the Empire travelled to Jerusalem for the Festival, it would make sense for the Romans to take a census. Also at Passover, many lambs would be sacrificed at the Temple in Jerusalem. 'He is believed to have been conceived on the 25th March, upon which day also He suffered.' (Augustine).

The date of Christmas may also have been chosen because the Roman winter solstice and midwinter festivals took place at this time. 'Saturnalia' honoured the god Saturn and 'Dies Natalis Solis Invicti' ('birthday of the unconquered sun') celebrated the sun god Mithra. Here we also see the Christian church 'redeeming' a pagan festival, by investing it with new Christian meaning.

This Christmas, let's not forget that we celebrate a real gift in real time for everyone: 'Thanks be to God for his indescribable gift!' (2 Cor 9:15).





CHRISTMAS CARDS

CARD or DECORATION

Here is a simple 3-D Christmas tree that you can use as a decoration or a card. You will need green card, crayons, glitter or paint, scissors and sticky tape.

Fold a piece of card in half, then cut it in half. Put the two pieces together and fold them in half again.

Draw half a Christmas tree opposite the fold. Cut along the line and you will have 2 identical trees. Fold the trees in half, very lightly, hardly creasing the centre line to mark the centre of the tree. Cut a slit along the bottom half of

the centre of one tree and along the top half of the centre

of the other tree. Slip the two trees together along the slits. To help the tree to stand firmly, use sticky tape to fasten the parts together where they meet.

Decorate the tree. If you are using it as a card then leave an area free

of decorations so that you can write on it.

All in the month of December

t was:

250 years ago: on 22nd Dec 1767 that John Newbery, the British publisher, died. He was one of the first to publish children's books, and the first to do so profitably and sustainably. Known as the 'Father of Children's Literature', the Newbery Medal for children's literature is awarded annually in his honor. Think how much poorer your childhood would have been, with your favorite stories!

200 years ago: on 7th Dec 1817 that William Bligh, British Royal Navy officer and colonial administrator, died. Best known as the captain of HMS Bounty when a historic mutiny (the Mutiny on the Bounty) took place in 1789. He was set adrift in a small boat with some of his loyal crew, but managed to travel over 4,000 miles without any navigational aids to Timor, from where he returned to England. It makes our modern need of a Satnav to go even 20 miles seem a bit pathetic.





150 years ago: on 6th Dec 1867 that (Marie) Jean Pierre Flourens, French physiologist and educator died. He was the first person to prove that the mind is located in the brain and not the heart. Does this mean we should be guided more by reason than feeling? He was also a pioneer of anesthesia.

125 years ago: on 18th Dec 1892 that Tchaikovsky's ballet The Nutcracker was performed for the first time, at the Mariinsky Theatre, in St Petersburg, Russia.

100 years ago: on 9th Dec 1917 that during the Battle of Jerusalem, the Ottoman Empire surrendered the city to the British. On 11th Dec, the British General Edmund Allenby entered the city on foot (rather than horseback or vehicle) as a mark of respect, becoming the first Christian to control the city in 500 years.

75 years ago: on 1st Dec 1942 that the British Government published the Beveridge Report, which formed the basis of the welfare state.

65 years ago: on 5th Dec 1952 that the

Great Smog of London took place. Dense, cold, smoke-filled fog descended upon London, bringing the city to a standstill for four days. More than 4,000 people died.

60 years ago: on 25th Dec 1957 that Queen Elizabeth II's Christmas Message was televised for the first time.

50 years ago: on 3rd Dec 1967 that the world's first successful human heart transplant was performed by a team led by Dr Christian Barnard in Cape Town. The patient, Louis Washkansky, survived for 18 days before dying from pneumonia due to a weakened immune system.

40 years ago: on 16th Dec 1977 that Heathrow Central (now Heathrow Terminals 1,2, 3) opened at Heathrow Airport as a station on the London Underground. It was the first airport in the world to be directly served by its city's underground railway system.

30 years ago: on 25th Dec 1987 that in the British TV soap opera Coronation Street, Hilda Ogden left the street to become her doctor's housekeeper in



the country. It was one of the mostwatched episodes in the show's



history.

20 years ago: on 11th Dec 1997 that the Kyoto Protocol, aimed at reducing greenhouse gas and combating global warming, was adopted at a conference in Japan. (Over 190 countries have signed the agreement, which came into effect in Feb 2005. Canada withdrew in Dec 2012.)

Also 20 years ago: on 11th Dec 1997 that Sinn Fein president Gerry Adams met British Prime Minister Tony Blair at 10 Downing Street – the first Irish Republican leader to do so since Michael Collins in 1921.

15 years ago: on 7th Dec 2002 that Iraq submitted a weapons declaration to the United Nations in which it stated it had no weapons of mass destruction.

10 years ago: on 23rd Dec 2007 that the British royal family launched The Royal Channel on the video sharing website YouTube.

Signs were seen in distant lands With wise men travelling from afar Having searched the skies at night Came following His natal star.


As we hear the Christmas message, If we think these things are true, We could come to seek this baby We could be like wise men too.
