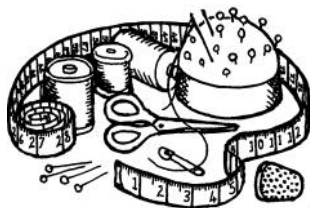
Teddy Church

Grants and Interest-free Loans for Energy Saving Home Improvements

The cold winter may have passed, but we still need to think about making sure our homes are ready for the worst of the weather. Remember the recent “Beast from the East” cold weather snap? For some people, preparing to keep warm in winter is a year-round concern, so Harrogate Borough Council is really keen for local residents to make the most of a special grant and interest-free loan scheme available for home energy efficiency improvements. There is only a limited time left to claim a grant – the scheme closes for new applications in September 2018.

The council has targeted the grants and interest-free loans at those who need them most:

- Households with an income less than £35,000 with an Energy Performance Certificate rating of E, F or G are all eligible. If their energy rating is D then they also need to be over 60, or have children under 16 in their household, or have a chronic illness which is affected by the cold. Our advisors can check householders’ home energy score or work it out for them, and check the other eligibility criteria if they are not sure.
- Households with an income less than £35,000 are automatically eligible if they live in one of these council wards: Granby, High Harrogate, Low Harrogate, New Park, Ripon Minster, Saltergate, Starbeck, Woodfield. Note that these are the old ward boundaries. Again, the advisors can check for eligibility if you are not sure.
- Disabled Facilities Grant recipients are automatically eligible, if their DFG contribution is less than £500.

The grant covers all kinds of loft and wall insulation. A contribution may sometimes be needed from the customer, but this will always be discussed with our advisors first. For new energy efficient and reliable boilers, an interest-free loan would cover the up-front cost.

All In The Month Of June

It was:
200 years ago, on 17th June 1818 that Charles Gounod was born. This French composer is best known for the well-loved *Ave Maria* and his operas, notably *Faust*.

175 years ago, on 26th June 1843 that the Treaty of Nanking came into effect following the First Opium War. As part of the treaty, China agreed to make Hong Kong a crown colony and cede it to Britain. (It was returned in July 1997.)

150 years ago, on 7th June 1868 that Charles Rennie Mackintosh, Scottish architect, artist and designer, was born. He was prominent in the Arts and Crafts movement and influenced European design movements such as Art Nouveau and Secessionism.

125 years ago, on 7th June 1893 that Mahatma Gandhi committed his first act of civil disobedience while working as a lawyer in South Africa. He refused to comply with racial segregation rules which prohibited coloured people from travelling first class on trains. He refused to leave a first-class carriage and was thrown off the train in Pietermaritzburg. (After protesting, he was allowed on the following day.)

Also 125 years ago, on 13th June 1893 that Dorothy L Sayers, Christian British mystery novelist, short story writer, playwright, essayist, critic and translator, was born. Best known for her play about Christ, *The Man Born to be King*, and her detective novels about Lord Peter Wimsey.

90 years ago, on 14th June 1928, that Emmeline Pankhurst, British political activist died. She was leader of the British suffragette movement.

Also 90 years ago, on 14th June 1928, that Che Guevara, iconic Argentine-born Marxist revolutionary, was born. As a guerrilla leader, tactician and leftist martyr, he became

a leading Communist figure in the Cuban Revolution. (Executed in 1967)

70 years ago, from 24th June 1948 to 12th May 1949, that the Berlin Blockade and Airlift took place. The Soviet Union began a rail, road and canal blockade of Berlin, cutting off all routes between West Germany and West Berlin. The Allies launched a massive airlift – over 200,000 flights – to take in nearly 9,000 tons of supplies each day.

65 years ago, on 2nd June 1953, that the coronation of Queen Elizabeth II at Westminster Abbey, London took place. (This was also the first event where the British TV audience was greater than the radio audience.)

50 years ago, on 6th June 1968 that Robert Kennedy, American politician was shot and killed. A Senator from New York, and former Attorney General, he was shot in Los Angeles while campaigning for the presidential nomination. Brother to US President John F Kennedy.

40 years ago, on 19th June 1978 that British cricketer Ian Botham became the first player in history to score a century and take eight wickets in a single Test match. (In the Second Test against Pakistan at Lord's Cricket Ground.)

30 years ago, on 11th June 1988 that Nelson Mandela's 70th Birthday Tribute took place at Wembley Stadium, and was broadcast to a worldwide audience of 600 million. Mandela was still in prison, and not released until February 1990. (His actual birthday was 18th July.)

15 years ago, on 20th June 2003 that the Wikimedia Foundation was founded in Florida. The non-profit charitable organisation operates several websites, including the popular online encyclopaedia Wikipedia.

So Aaron made a gold bull and the people went wild.

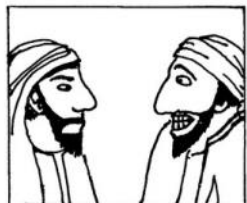

Members also raised over £200 with a cake stall in Askwith as the Tour de Yorkshire passed through the village.

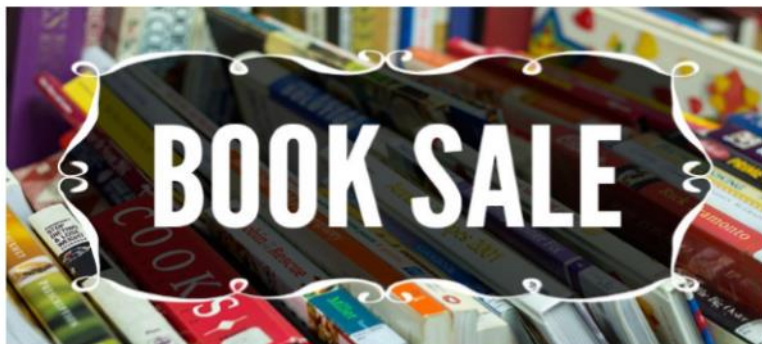
