

#### Some items of interest.

The parish council are extremely concerned about the river erosion and a dangerous tree in Castley. The river particularly at times of flood is causing erosion of the river bank to the point where very soon some action will have to be taken to prevent the road being affected. Near to this part of the river a tree is overhanging the road with the possibility that if it fell the road would be closed. Our concerns have been reported to officials at North Yorkshire County Council who tell us that they are closely monitoring the situation.

The white road markings on Leathley Lane marking the middle of the road and no overtaking have worn away and are difficult to see. After this issue was reported North Yorkshire Highways are arranging for the markings to be repainted.

There is concern about speeding traffic travelling along Farnley Lane and the parish has agreed with Otley Town council to jointly fund a speed restriction sign. As Leeds City Council is the Highways authority their agreement is needed before the sign is erected.

The parish caretaker continues to carry out work around the parish (e.g. cutting back overgrowth at junctions to improve visibility). If anyone is aware of work that they feel needs to be carried out please send details to the Clerk (contact details below).







*'Pendle Witch Country'* VISIT. Leaving Swinsty Moor car park by coach to visit the Pendle Heritage Centre at Barrowford in the Forest of Bowland AONB. The visit costs **£29.50 for members** or **£37 for nonmembers** and includes the coach, lunch of pie and peas (choose either cheese and onion or meat and potato), a video and entry to the museum and restored 18<sup>th</sup> century walled garden. There is a café for extra refreshments if required. We leave by 3pm. Wednesday 4 September 9-4.30pm.

'The Lost World of Sir Arthur Conan Doyle' TALK. Roger Chapman recalls a scientific expedition to Conan Doyle's 'Lost World', a table top mesa called Mount Roraima some 300 miles into the Amazonian rain forest. His group parachuted in and spent two months collecting flora and fauna for Kew Gardens and the National History Museum. Thursday 5 September 7.30-9pm. Cost £7.50 or £6 for members.

**'A Walk in the Park' TALK.** Join Alan Hulme, Head of Park Management, for an illustrated talk on the work and history of the Yorkshire Dales National Park which culminated in the designation of the new extended area in August 2016. #### All in the Month of September

500 years ago, from 20<sup>th</sup> Sept 1519 to 1522 that Portuguese explorer Ferdinand Magellan led a Spanish expedition to the East Indies. It became the first circumnavigation of the world. But Magellan was killed in a battle with natives in the Philippines in 1521.

125 years ago, on 1<sup>st</sup> Sept 1894 that the General Post Office in the UK sanctioned the use of picture postcards and introduced a half-penny postage rate for them. This led to a boom in picture postcards and the extensive photographic documentation of towns and landscapes.

Also 125 years ago, on 28<sup>th</sup> Sept 1894 that the British retail chain Marks and Spencer was founded when Michael Marks acquired his first permanent stall in Leeds covered market and invited Thomas Spencer to become his business partner.

100 years ago, on 12<sup>th</sup> Sept 1919 that Adolf Hitler joined the fledgling German Worker's Part, which would later become the Nazi Party.

80 years ago, on 1<sup>st</sup> Sept 1939 that Germany invaded Poland, beginning World War II.

75 years ago, from 17<sup>th</sup> to 25<sup>th</sup> Sept 1944 that Operation Market Garden took place. The Allies attempted a massive airborne invasion of Germanoccupied Netherlands but were forced to withdraw. (The story was told in A Bridge too Far.) 70 years ago, on 30<sup>th</sup> Sept 1949 that the Berlin Airlift ended after 14 months and over 270,000 flights.

65 years ago, on 29<sup>th</sup> Sep 1954 that CERN (the European Organization for Nuclear Research) was established in Geneva Switzerland.

40 years ago, on 29<sup>th</sup> Sept 1979 that Pope John Paul II became the first pope to visit Ireland.

15 years ago, from 1<sup>st</sup> to 3<sup>rd</sup> Sept, that the Beslan school hostage crisis took place in Russia. Armed terrorists took more than 1,100 children and adults hostage. Russian security forces ended the crisis on the third day, entering the school with tanks and heavy weapons. More than 300 hostages were killed, including 186 children, and hundreds more were injured.

Also 15 years ago, on 30<sup>th</sup> Sept 2004 that the Iraq Survey Group released its final report (the Duelfer Report) on Iraq's purported weapons of mass destruction programme, following the 2003 invasion of Iraq. It concluded that Iraq had not had any weapons of mass destruction since 1991.

10 years ago, on 14<sup>th</sup> Sept 2009 that Keith Floyd, the British celebrity cook, television presenter, restauranteur and writer, died.
