

Please let me encourage you, if you feel able to give, to donate even a little to one of the many charities who are trying to help. I am reminded of the words of Jesus in Matthew's gospel Chapter 25

" 35 For I was hungry and you gave me something to eat, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you invited me in, I needed clothes and you clothed me, I was sick and you looked after me, I was in prison and you came to visit me.'

³⁷ "Then the righteous will answer him, 'Lord, when did we see you hungry and feed you, or thirsty and give you something to drink? 38 When did we see you a stranger and invite you in, or needing clothes and clothe you? 39 When did we see you sick or in prison and go to visit you?'

⁴⁰ "The King will reply, 'Truly I tell you, whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you did for me.'

In a different way there are also those in this country that need help with feeding their families which we can perhaps help in a different way by offering a couple of tins of something we can spare or even buying some dry goods such as pasta or rice and donating to the local food bank. A small gesture of kindness that could mean a great deal to another family.

Please keep those in need in all your prayers and if you can help in a practical way that would be a wonderful way to celebrate Harvest time here in the Washburn and Mid-Wharfe Benefice.





All in the month of September

It was:

1,100 years ago, on 4th Sept 925 that England gained her first ever king. He was Aethelstan, King of the Anglo-Saxons (924-927) and then King of England (927-939). Aethelstan was grandson of Alfred the Great, and 30th great-grand uncle to Queen Elizabeth

300 years ago, on 29th Sept 1725 that Robert Clive, 1st Baron Clive (Clive of India) was born. This British general helped to found the British Empire in India.

200 years ago, on 27th Sept 1825 that the world's first public railway opened. It was the Stockton and Darlington Railway in north-east England.

175 years ago, on 9th Sept 1850 that California was admitted as the 31st state of the USA.

150 years ago, on 3rd Sept 1875 that Ferdinand Porsche, Austrian-born German automotive engineer was born. He designed the Volkswagen Beetle and Tiger tank, and founded the Porsche sports car company.

100 years ago, on 7th Sept 1925 that Laura Ashley was born. The Welsh designer and businesswoman was known for her traditional printed fabrics, soft furnishing and women's clothing. Co-founder (along with her husband) of the Laura Ashley textile company and chain of shops. (Died in 1985 when she fell downstairs, aged 60.)

100 years ago, on 8th Sept that Peter Sellers, actor and comedian was born. Best known for the Goon Show, and as Inspector Clouseau in the Pink Panther film series. (Died 1980.)

90 years ago, on 3rd Sept 1935 that British driver Malcolm Campbell set a new world land speed record of 301.13 mph in Bluebird at Bonneville Salt Flats, Utah. First person to break the 300mph barrier.

90 years ago, on 15th Sept 1935 that the Nuremberg Laws were passed in Germany. Jews were no longer classed as German citizens, and the Nazi flag was adopted as the national flag.

80 years ago, on 2nd Sept 1945 that V-J Day (victory over Japan Day) took place. Representatives from Japan signed the formal instrument of surrender on board the US battleship USS Missouri in Tokyo Bay.

Also 80 years ago, on on occasional live Toguri (Tokyo Rose), an American-Also 80 years ago, on 5th Sept 1945 that

born Japanese radio propaganda
broadcaster during WWII was arrested
by US forces in Yokohama.

Mompesson was Rector of Eyam throughout its well-known self-imposed quarantine during the outbreak of plague in 1665/6. A later clergyman inadvertently ensured that the detailed Parish records were preserved. The Birds in Your Garden



Where have all the birds gone?

At this time of year, I'm often asked why gardens are suddenly empty. From the hustle and bustle, and the regular need to top-up feeders, to the strange lack of movement in the shrubbery.

Well, it's perfectly normal.....

So where are all they all? As always with bird behaviour there are several reasons.

Firstly, they can't all stay close by there just isn't enough room – or food. As with most specie, not just birds, their parents will be encouraging them to find their own territories and set up home in another corner of the world.

Secondly, the end of the breeding season means that males no longer need to attract a mate, or defend a territory, so they don't need to sing anymore. That Blackbird sitting at the top of the tree outside your bedroom window at 3am every morning no longer has a reason to waste energy by singing his head off, though a few still do! Once breeding finishes, most birds go their separate ways, and with the exception of species which continue to hold territories, such as Robins and Wrens, songs fall silent.

Thirdly, as they get into the end of the breeding season, a lot of garden regulars will enter the moult. This is the time of year when many birds lose their feathers worn by incessant dashing about feeding young, and

replace them with new ones. Many juvenile birds will also lose their first plumage, ready to emerge as adults. The energy cost of growing a new set of feathers is high, and losing a primary wing feather or two can really make a difference when trying to evade a predator. For this reason, a lot of the birds will lay low, skulking in bushes and hiding in hedges. This is particularly noticeable with Blackbirds which otherwise seem to be around most of the year.

About half of UK species are migratory, either in the winter or summer, so many will start to head back to their long-term homes in August, too. This includes birds which we have been sharing spaces with, such as Swifts. Swallows and House Martins will stay around until September or October.

There's a chance that birds can
disappear from your garden because a
predator has moved into the vicinity.
A Sparrowhawk may have taken up
residence nearby, or a cat may have
arrived in the neighbourhood. Birds
need to feel safe, so if they think that
they will be attacked in your garden
they will move away.

Possibly the most important reason for the lack of birds during the summer months though, is that they simply don't need your garden at this time of year. There is an abundance of berries and seeds in the wider countryside during the autumn, which provide the nutrients that birds need. Lots of garden birds will head out into the wider countryside to fill up on these

widely available calorific treats. House Sparrows, Starlings and many finches like to feed on grain spilt after the harvest too, so if you're near farmland, they're likely to be out feasting in the fields.

When this annual abundance runs out, usually as November approaches, 'your' birds will be back!

- Stew gently some tomatoes with a little butter
- Add salt and pepper to taste
- When soft mash with a fork and add a well beaten egg
- Stir until it thickens
- Serve on hot buttered toast.

70 years ago, on 21st Sep 1955 that Britain annexed Rockall, an uninhabited granite islet in the North Atlantic, to prevent the Soviet Union from placing surveillance equipment there to spy on Britian's secret nuclear missile tests.

70 years ago, on 22nd Sept 1955 that Britain's first independent TV channel was launched, ITV.

70 years ago, 26th Sept 1955 that Bird's Eye frozen fish fingers went on sale in the UK.

60 years ago, on 4th Sept 1965 that Albert Schweitzer, German-born French theologian, philosopher, organist, physician and missionary doctor to Africa, died. Winner of the 1952 Nobel Peace Prize.

50 years ago, on 24th Sept 1975that Dougal Haston and Doug Scott became the first Britons to reach the summit of Mount Everest. They were also the first climbers from any nation to conguer the south-west face.

30 years ago, on 3rd Sept 1995 that the online auction site eBay was founded (as AuctionWeb). The first item sold was a broken laser pointer.

20 years ago, on 12th Sept 2005 that the evacuation of all Israeli security forces and Israeli civilian settlements from the Gaza Strip was completed. Israel had occupied the Gaza Strip for 38 years.

15 years ago, on 19th Sept 2010 that the Deepwater Horizon oil spill in the Gulf of Mexico was finally sealed after gushing oil for almost five months. It was the biggest marine oil spill in history. In 2016 BP agreed to pay fines of \$20.8 billion – the largest corporate settlement in US history. BP also paid more than \$65 billion in clean-up costs.

Gardeners Corner



It was a bit of a shock to have stormy weather at the beginning of August. Let us hope for a quiet September which is usually a gentle month; it is a good time to look back over the summer and see what worked well in the garden. As it has been such a dry summer you may want to change a few things and be prepared to mulch everything really well to condition the soil and retain as much moisture as possible. If you don't already have one, it's a good idea to install a water butt to collect and store rainwater.

Remember to bring houseplants back indoors and don't over water them as they need much less as light levels diminish. If you intend to keep tender pelargoniums, bring them indoors before there is any risk of frost. Give them a bit of a trim and they should reward you next year. Tomatoes in the greenhouse will still be cropping so will need water and a feed. Potatoes

can be lifted for storing; choose a dry day and leave them on the soil to dry off before placing them in a dark frost free place. The apple harvest will be in full swing, pick the fruit carefully to avoid bruising and store individually, so that they don't touch one another, in boxes. Check regularly for any damaged/rotting ones and remove straight away.

Time now to get the birdfeeders back up, but do keep cleaning them to avoid spreading disease. The birds will also enjoy any fallen fruit and the seeds from perennial plants, so don't be too tidy!

Finally look ahead to the coming seasons and think about colourful bulbs to plant ready for spring displays. Prepared hyacinths can be planted this month for Christmas fragrance. Most of all, enjoy the change that September brings.


